Dick McClanathan, Planner, representing the joint Douglas County-City of Lawrence Planning Commission, appeared before the Board with a prepared joint resolution of the Board of Douglas County Commissioners and ordinance of the City of Lawrence, Kansas. The resolution provides for the adoption of subdivision regulations as provided by statute. The resolution will be Douglas County Resolution No. 72-25. Following due discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that joint Resolution No. 72-25 be hereby adopted, seconded by Mr. Ice, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt from Bert Nash Community Mental Health Center, Inc., of the following: Minutes of June 12 and June 28; Statement of Revenue and Expenditures for June and July for Bert Nash and Lawrence-Douglas County Joint Board of Health; and Bert Nash Staff-Patient Hours for June and July.

At the appointed time of 9:30 a.m., Mr. Steven B. Rhudy, representing the City of Lawrence, appeared before the Board relative to a petition for the vacation of a certain alleyway on the East side of Ohio Street. No persons appeared in objection to the vacation whereupon the Board determined the following:

1. That the Board has jurisdiction of subject matter of said Petition, pursuant to K.S.A. 1971 Supp. 12-504 et. seq.
2. That notice of hearing on said Petition and the affidavit of publication thereof are examined and found to have been duly made in strict conformity with the laws of the State of Kansas.
3. That no private rights will be injured or endangered by such vacation.
4. That no written objection to said Petition has been filed with the County Clerk at the time of or prior to this hearing.
5. That the public will suffer no loss or inconvenience by said vacation, and that in justice to the petitioner the prayer of the petitioner should be and the same is hereby granted.
6. That there shall be reserved to the City of Lawrence, Kansas, and all owners of lesser rights, for public utilities, rights-of-ways and easements for public service facilities, all such rights now in existence and use.
7. That the County Clerk shall certify a copy of this order to the Register of Deeds of Douglas County, Kansas, for recording as provided by K.S.A. 1971 Supp. 12-505.

With these determinations it was moved by Mr. Ice that the vacation of the alleyway described in the Order of Vacation be hereby ordered vacated. Motion was seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Thursday, August 24, 1972.
