Approved the minutes of the meeting of September 25, 1972. Mr. Ward Thompson, representing Union Cab Company and Yellow Cab Company, Inc., Ward Stompson & John Denich holders of the Lawrence taxi franchise, and Mr. John Derrick, Welfare Director, appeared before the Board to discuss possible solution to the problem of transportation for the elderly and handicapped citizens of our community. Mr. Thompson indicated that there possibly will be funds available from the Urban discussed transportation Mass Transportation Administration which will be coordinated with the local problems of alderly + handicapped transportation committee of the Council on Aging. Mr. Thompson proposes that his company would charge a nominal fee for the transportation of eligible elderly and handicapped citizens with the federal program subsidizing such operation. Mr. Derrick indicated that many welfare clients throughout the county were in need of such special transportation service. Discussion developed that the Board was in complete agreement that the transportation costs to the elderly and handicapped citizens of our community were an item of considerable concern to these citizens. It was moved by Mr. Ice that we support and endorse all efforts by Mr. Thompson to coordinate transportation subsidization by the federal agency with the Council on Aging of our community, and further that we request Mr. Derrick to work closely with the program in order that elderly and handicapped welfare clients may be properly served by the program should it become operable. Motion was seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously. on needs The Board noted receipt of a survey on the needs of the aging conducted by the Lund of the aging local Council on Aging. Darwin Rogers, Assessor, informed the Board that as of October 1, 1972, he men Zuster would be employing Herman Tusher on a temporary basis at \$335 per month, with salary to be computed on an hourly basis.
