Wakarusa Township Board rejected closing 990' of Township Rd. 31

The Board noted communication from the Wakarusa Township Board advising that the Wakarusa Township Board did not deem it advisable to close 990 feet of Township Road No. 31 at this time.

Lawrence Flood Protection - received draft of revision - mental statement

The Board noted receipt of copies of letters from Mr. Charles D. Stough, Attorney for the Douglas County Kaw Drainage District, and Mr. George T. Faler, President of the Douglas County Kaw Drainage District, to the U. S. Corps of Engineers setting out their conclusions relating to the revised draft of the environmental statement for the Lawrence, Kansas Flood Protection Project.

Purchase: 7 new patrol cars from Turner Chevrolet

The Board reviewed with Sheriff Johnson the bids received on December 6, 1972, to supply seven new patrol cars for the sheriff department. Sheriff Johnson reported to the Board the specifications of the low bidder were completely acceptable. With this information it was moved by Mr. Cragan that we officially accept the low bid of Turner Chevrolet in the amount of \$15,506.57 to furnish seven new patrol cars to the sheriff department with allowance for seven trade-ins, seconded by Mr. Ice, and carried unanimously.
