Also subject to condition No. 6 revised to read as follows:

6. That a ten foot permanent maintenance and construction easement be provided on both sides of what has been referred to as 18th Street for road purposes only

And the addition of a 7th condition as follows:

7. That revised cross sections be approved by the County Engineer

Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.

Mr. McClanathan then presented to the Board Item No. 9 of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of July 25, 1973, which was a request by J H & J Rock Company, Inc., on property owned by Elmer Zeeb, for a Conditional Use Permit to allow the operation of a rock quarry, generally located upon a 143 acre tract, along the east and west sides of Douglas County Road No. 1025, three-fourths mile south of U.S. Highway No. 40. It was moved by Mr. Heck that inasmuch as this Board now has an informal request from the applicant for withdraw of request for a Conditional Use Permit, that this Board approve the applicant's withdraw request with a part of this motion being a stipulation that this Board expresses intent not to consider within one year's time any Conditional Use Permit request by this applicant for a rock quarry operation which would include a substantial part of that area described in CUP-5-3-73. Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of the rent payment for the month of August from Valleyview Care Home in the amount of \$250.

Bob Steele, Lone Star Caretaker, appeared before the Board to request a sixmonth salary increase for Ronald Guthrie, an employee of the Park Department. It was moved by Mr. Heck that a six-month salary increase of \$25 per month be granted Ronald Guthrie effective September 1, 1973, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Wayne Kellum, Zoning Administrator, appeared before the Board to request the employment of Gail Hack. After due discussion it was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board approve the request for the employment of Gail Hack in the Zoning Office on a half-time basis at a salary of \$165 per month effective August 8, 1973, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously. The employment of Gail Hack is a replacement for Teresa Posey who terminated her employment on August 8, 1973.

On August 8, 1973, the Board received a letter from Fred Barkley, Treasurer of the Willow Springs Township, informing the Board of his resignation as of this date. It was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board accept the resignation of Mr. Barkley as Treasurer of Willow Springs Township and write a letter of appreciation to Mr. Barkley. Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Thursday, August 9, 1973.
