Res # 73-30: Wayne Kellum, Zoning Administrator, presented to the Board prepared Resolution No. 73-30 which resolution relates to and amending of regulated planning and Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas. Specifically this resolution relates to the rezoning from A (Agricultural) to I-4 (Heavy Industrial) of the following described property:

The East Half of the East Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section Four (4), Township Thirteen (13) South, Range twenty (20) East of the Sixth principal meridian, Douglas County, Kansas, less that part thereof conveyed for highway purposes in deed recorded in Book 266, Page 13

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of October 11, 1973.

Comm Order # 1141 The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 1141. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Personnel: David Berkowitz, County Attorney, appeared before the Board to request a leave of absence for Michael Malone for a period of three months starting October 15, 1973. Also that he be replaced by Tim Degginger on an hourly basis at \$20 per hour, as needed. This situation will be subject to review on November 15, 1973. It was moved by Mr. Heck that these requests be granted, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Terminated: Dean Sanderson, Public Works Director, notified the Board of the termination of David Blackman, assistant to County Engineer, effective October 11, 1973.

Retiring: Treasurer Edythe Norman notified the Board that Clara Jones is retiring from the Treasurer's office on October 17, 1973.

Clinton Parkway: The Board received a tentative draft of a bill from Congressman Larry Winn, Jr., pertaining to the Clinton Parkway defined as a highway running from 23rd and Iowa Streets, westward approximately 4.1 miles to the Clinton Lake Access Road A.

Personnel: The Board noted receipt of Presidential Executive Order No. 11701 which order relates to priority given to the hiring of Vietnam veterans. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that a memorandum be directed to all county officials and department heads relative to the executive order, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously.

Road & Bridge: Dean Sanderson, Public Works Director, appeared before the Board submitting a request for two miles of road construction on FAS Route No. 1369 beginning near center of Section 10, T14S, R18E thence North to a point approximately 855 feet West of center of and which includes Section 34, T13S, R18E at an estimated cost of \$151,000. It was moved by Mr. Heck that this request be forwarded to the State Highway Commission, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Road & Bridge: Mr. Sanderson also submitted an agreement between Douglas County, Kansas and Finney and Turnipseed, consulting engineers, relative to field surveys, designs, plans, specifications, and construction engineering services for grading and culverts on FAS Route 1369 beginning at the intersection of FAS Route 1369 and FAS Route 1371 near the center of Section 10, T14S, R18E thence north approximately two miles to an intersection with a proposed road to be constructed in conjunction with Clinton Lake, such intersection to be approximately 855 feet west of the center corner of Section 34, T13S, R18E, at a cost of \$9,000. It was moved by Mr. Heck that this agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.
