clinton Parkway: Discussion

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The Board received a letter from the Kansas Park and Resources Authority acknowledging receipt of the contract for the installation of the guard rail and the plans and specifications for Wells Overlook Park. The letter is from Stanley L. Kivett, Recreation Planner, and states that the documents have been reviewed and are approved.

Chinton Packway. The Board received acknowledgement from Larry Winn, Jr., pertaining to the acknowledgement updated information on the Clinton Parkway. for Jarry Winn

Bob Steele, Caretaker of Lone Star Lake, requested the employment of Charles Nichols at a salary of \$400 per month effective November 1, 1973. It was moved by Mr. Heck that this request be approved, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously. This employee is to be paid from the Park fund.

The Board received the Jail Inspection Report made for the May, 1973, Term of District Court. With due allowance for its age the jail is presently adequate for the safekeeping of prisoners. The Board noted there are some repairs that The entire jail operation appears to be orderly, however, the should be made. facilities are in need of repair. The report was signed by James W. Paddock, District Judge, Division No. 2, and David Berkowitz, County Attorney.

Dean Sanderson, Public Works Director, submitted a prepared contract for easement for right-of-way for highway purposes. This agreement was made this 24th day of October, 1973, by and between H. L. Broyles and Marilyn G. Broyles, husband and wife, 1223 Laura Avenue, Lawrence, Kansas, and the Board of County Commissioners, and is located in the SW ½ of SW ½ of Section 11, Township 15, Range 19, in Douglas County, more particularly described as project for West Tauy Creek, Bridge No. 1.00-12.00, for the lump sum of \$201.62, which includes 0.137 acres of right-of-way and other considerations. It was moved by Mr. Heck that this contract be approved, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.
