Dick McClanathan, Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Director, presented to the Board Item No. 5 of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of January 23, 1974, which was a request to rezone approximately 1.0 acres from A (Agricultural) to B-2 (General Business), generally located 3.5 miles west of Baldwin Junction on the north side of Highway 56 (Worden), submitted by Kenneth L. Pettibon. After due discussion it was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board accept the recommendation of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission which was for the rezoning of approximately 1.0 acres from A (Agricultural) to B-2 (General Business), with the rezoning to be effective upon proper publication. Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.
