Wayne Kellum, Zoning Administrator, presented to the Board prepared Resolution No. 74-7 which resolution relates to and amending of regulated planning and Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas. Specifically this resolution relates to the rezoning from A (Agricultural) to B-2 (General Business) of the following described property:

Beginning at a point 507 feet east of the southwest corner of Section 32, Township 14 South, Range 19 East; thence north 303.5 feet; thence east 143.5 feet; thence south 303.5 feet; thence west 143.5 feet to the point of beginning, less the south 49.8 feet of said tract for highway right-of-way. The above described tract contains 1.0 acres more or less.

It was moved by Mr. Heck that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

West Feed Company to furnish 2,773 gallons of 2,4-D at an average cost of \$3.98 per gallon and that we further accept the proposal of J. West Feed Company to supply an additional 1,225 gallon of the same material and payment for same to be made as soon as reimbursed funds from the sale of 2,4-D are available.
