It was also generally agreed that the basic major funding of the regional organization might well be by a county mill levy.

Dick McClanathan, Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Director, appeared before the Board to bring to the Board's attention Item No. 9 of the minutes of the April 24, 1974 minutes of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission. This item refers to Text Amendment with reference to Douglas County Resolution No. 72-25, "Subdivision Regulations and Development Regulations for Douglas County, Kansas, and the City of Lawrence, Kansas," Article VII, Section 704. This Text Amendment makes certain changes relative to the installation of sidewalks within the incorporated area of the City of Lawrence but does not change the sidewalk requirement as pertains to the unincorporated area of Douglas County, Kansas. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that we approve the recommendation of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission which was for the adoption of the Text Amendment, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously. This Text Amendment will become official upon publication.
