The Board noted Change Order No. 1 to the Supplemental Agreement of the bridge contract for the bridge over West Tany Creek, making the total final contract \$47,621.75. It was moved by Mr. Heck that this supplemental agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Kans. River Bridge:
Discussed
with John
Frazier recent
proposal of
Barnett-Stuart

The Board discussed with John Frazier, representing Finney & Turnipseed, consultants, the most recent proposal of Barnett-Stuart to provide geology for the proposed Kansas River Bridge project. This new proposal sets out the revised "dead costs" to Barnett-Stuart and relates to additional work involved in a second alignment. The proposal sets out individual per item costs for which Douglas County will be billed. The proposal further sets out a maximum cost of \$33,000 provided that Douglas County will be billed only for additional services performed at the rate set out in the proposal for each of these services. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the Board accept the proposal and request Barnett-Stuart to prepare a contract for the proposal, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Tuesday, August 27, 1974, for the sole purpose of opening the bids for the Judicial-Law Enforcement Center. All other business will be conducted on Wednesday, August 28, 1974.

The Board of Douglas County Commissioners met in special session at 2:00 p.m. with all members of the Board being present, for the specific purpose of receiving bids for the Douglas County Judicial-Law Enforcement Center. The meeting was convened to the District I Courtroom in order to provide necessary seating space. At the appointed time Mr. Richard Peters, representing the architectural firm on the project, opened and read aloud bids submitted by the following six contracting firms:

B. A. Green Construction Co.	3,963,000
Kansas Construction Co.	4,275,000
M. W. Watson, Inc.	4,445,000

It was determined that B. A. Green Construction Company of Lawrence, Kansas, submitted the apparent low bid. Following due discussion it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the bids be taken under advisement, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously.
