- (6) The approval of \$773 for equipment to be paid out of county funds but to be reimbursed by the state near the termination of the grant.

It was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board accept the above items, which are part of "Douglas County Research Evaluation of Corrections Systems for Program Development". Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback and carried unanimously.
