A delegation, representing Girl Scouts organization with Mrs. Jack Rose as spokesman, appeared before the Board to discuss with the Board and park supervisor Bob Steele certain refurbishings which they felt should be accomplished in regard to the building known as Girl Scouts at Lone Star Lake. Following due discussion it was basically agreed that refurbishing of the building to the extent of flooring, ceiling, doors, and other basic necessities would be accomplished on a priority basis by Mr. Steele and his workmen, and that giving effect to the fact that the Girl Scouts organization pays the utilities cost of that building that they continue to have rights of priority use of said building with other groups having use of such building at times when not being used by the Girl Scouts. It is further understood that any other group wishing to use this building must make reservations at least two weeks in advance of such use.

The Board received petition for attachment of adjoining lands to Douglas County Rural Water District No. 3. It was moved by Mr. Whitenight that the Board set the date of July 23, 1975, at 11:00 a.m., in the Commission Room of the Douglas County Courthouse for hearing on this petition.

Mr. Dick Gibb, representing Federal Siren Company, manufacturers of the sirens recently installed by Douglas County, discussed with the Board causes of siren difficulties experienced in the late Winter and Spring of 1975. Mr. Gibb explained that his company had found it necessary to provide modification kit which should be replaced at each of our sirens. Mr. Gibb indicated that his company would furnish these modification kits, which the County could have installed at any time at their decision. The modification kits being pro-vided free of charge and installation charge is the responsibility of Douglas County.
