Barber, Chief, Engineering Division, Kansas City District, Corps of Engineers, of construction plans and specifications for the Mud Creek Unit, Lawrence, Kansas, Flood Protection Project. The notice advised that plans and specifications were sent to prospective bidders on March 25, 1976, and that the bid opening date has been changed to April 28, 1976.

Marge Fisher, councilwoman of Lecompton, and Ernest Coleman, community development consultant, discussed with the Board quotes which had been received in response to advertisement relative to covering the Lecompton landfill which is no longer in use. The Board noted that the City of Lecompton had received two quotes, the lowest in the amount of \$1200 from Herb Roberts Excavating & Hauling Company. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the Board take these quotes under advisement until development of a firm contract, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Ernest Coleman, community development consultant, discussed with the Board appraisers reports, negotiations carried out, and HUD guidelines which he had followed relative to the purchase of certain described property owned by Mr. & Mrs. Loman Lathrom, which property lies in the vicinity from 19th & Harper Streets partially adjoining Douglas County Fairgrounds property. Mr. Coleman presented to the Board a proposed contract which had been agreed to by Mr. Lathrom calling for the sale of that property consisting of 8.54 acres, more or less, for a sum of \$24,000. This land, if purchased, would become part of the fairgrounds with purchase funded by community development funds. Following due discussion it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that we take this contract under advisement and for further discussion with counsel, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Ron Jones, planning consultant in developing Douglas County Comprehensive Planning; Dick McClanathan, Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Director; and Ernest Coleman, community development administrator, discussed with the Board proposed contract with the University of Kansas Center for Research which contract would provide for the University of Kansas Center for Research furnishing certain aerial photography evaluation services to Douglas County.
