The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of October 18, 1976.

Comm. Order # 1564 The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 1564. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Monthly Fee Reports The Board approved monthly fee reports for the following County offices: Sheriff, County Court, County Clerk, Public Works Department, and Register of Deeds.

Pub. Works: Engineer Sanderson presented the Board prepared contracts, performance, maintenance, and statutory bonds between Douglas County and Bushman Construction Company relative to Douglas County Project No. 76-4, Bridge No. 19.53N-15.00E. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the Board approve prepared contracts, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Legal Notice: The Board noted receipt of information from the Kansas Department of Transportation relative to the following legal notice: Residents of Douglas County and interested persons are hereby notified that Douglas County has received approval from the Kansas Department of Transportation of the location and design features for rural road improvement. The project begins 0.6 mile east of the Osage-Douglas County line and 1.5 miles north of US-56 and extends east approximately 0.2 mile. Approval has been granted for grading, surfacing, and seeding for a rural two-lane facility. Maps, drawings and other pertinent information in support of the location and design approval are available for public inspection at the County Engineer's office, Lawrence, Kansas.

Zoning: Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, appeared before the Board with Mr. Skeet Smith, representing N. R. Hamm Quarry, to discuss with the Board request by the N. R. Hamm Quarry for temporary use permit for an asphalt plant on the lease held by the Hamm Quarry on the following described property: Section 15, Township 13, Range 21, E 30 acres of the N $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , and the N $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of said section. Following due discussion it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that this temporary use permit be granted to be in effect for the purpose of supplying asphalt on what is known as the K-10 paving project conditioned upon N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc. being the prime contractor or supplier of asphalt on this project and further conditioned on compliance with all conditions as set out on the temporary use permit form and further conditioned that township roads leading from the site of the asphalt plant to the project construction site be dust proof and maintained with the satisfaction of the Eudora Township Board and Board of Douglas County Commissioners, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously. The permit expires January 1, 1978.

Payment to KU The Board discussed the request from the Bicentennial commission that the Board approved payment in the amount of \$470.95 to the University of Kansas for share expenses for the Wagon Train appearance in connection with bicentennial celebration. Following review of the request it was moved by Mr. Whitenight that this statement be approved for payment, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

County Well: The Board review and discussed communication from Mr. Richard Hack, sanitarian of the Lawrence-Douglas Health Department, which communication indicated to the Board that water from county wells should not be assumed to be safe for human consumption unless properly treated. Following review of the discussion it was moved by Mr. Whitenight in view of the communication from Mr. Hack that all county wells be posted as follows: Water Intended for Livestock Use Only. Motion was seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Bid-app. At 11:00 a.m., as officially advertised, the Board opened bids received for the site utilities plan to remodel the Douglas County Courthouse building. Only one bid was received, that being submitted by Norris Brothers in the amount of \$9880 for the base bid with Alternate No. 1 carrying total of \$1470. Mr. Jim Williams, represented the architectural firm of Peters, Williams & Kubota, reviewed the bid with the Board and recommended to the Board that the bid of Norris Brothers for this project be accepted. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the recommendation of Mr. Williams be accepted and the bid for this project be awarded to Norris Brothers, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.
