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duals. After consideration of this agreement it was moved by Mr. Neis that we execute the agreement, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously. A copy of this agreement is on file in the commission office.

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Mr. McFarlane presented an agreement between Douglas County, Kansas, and the following employees: Gary Sharp, Roger Lee, and James Murray. These being three of the four people who are going to attend the Emergency Mobile Intensive Care training at the Kansas University Center. These agreements evidence a commitment by these individuals for a continuance of their employ-ment with the Douglas County Ambulance Service upon the completion of their training. After discussion and review of these agreements it was moved by Mr. Neis that these agreements be accepted, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously. A copy of these agreements will be on file in the commission office.

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Mr. Willard Nice, representing the former operators of Valleyview Care Home, appeared before the Board to present the bill of sale for personal property which Douglas County purchased from Willard and Dorothy Nice upon their retirement from the business. The amount of the purchase was \$15,000. The check has been remitted to the Nices' and they returned this bill of sale to complete the transaction. The completed bill of sale and inventory of items will be on file in the commission office.

County Clerk Delbert Mathia appeared before the Board to arrange for part-time office help as is needed periodically making use of previously ex-perienced personnel. The request included a raise of rate of pay for these individuals from \$2.50 per hour to \$2.75 per hour. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this request be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of communication from the district marketing manager Telephone SOXNW of Southwestern Bell which indicated that pursuant to paragraph five of our word motion Public Telephone Service Agreement, a change will be made in the rate of tate of 10% two, commission which Douglas County will receive on collecting revenues from promobility of all collected revenues.

At the appointment hour of 10:00, designated for public hearing on planning items, Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Director Dick McClanathan appeared before the Board to present an application for a conditional use permit sub-mitted by N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc. The permit request was forwarded to the Hamom Quarry, McBoard of Commissioners with a unanimous recommendation from the planning commission subject to certain conditions. After thorough discussion on the matter it was moved by Mr. Neis that the recommendation of the planning commission be accepted subject to those conditions as amended by the Douglas County Commission. The conditions follow:

- That entrance to the site from County Road 1029 be constructed to stand-ards and specifications set by the County Engineer; 1.
- That all applicable regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency, 2. Kansas Department of Health and Environmental Frotection Agency Commission, Kansas Department of Agriculture-Water Resources Division, and any other applicable agency be strictly adhered to, and that any permit required by these agencies be obtained;
- That the applicant, N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc., enter into an agreement with Douglas County Board of Commissioners in regard to the maintaining of that portion of Douglas County Road No. 1029 regularly used by N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc. vehicles in the operation of the quarry for which the Con-ditional Use Permit, No. CUP-11-5-76, is approved. Such agreement shall provide and require that upon the applicants opening of the afore-mentioned approved quarry he (N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc.) shall be respon-sible for dust proofing said County Road No. 1029 a minimum distance of 300 feet in either direction in front of any home along the affected portion of said County Road No. 1029. Maintenance costs of this road shall, during period of quarry operation, be the responsibility of N. R. Hamm Quarry, Inc. for the duration of the Conditional Use Permit and said road shall be maintained in such manner as to prevent damage to vehicles utilizing the road and to prevent, to the extent practical, the occurrence of unsafe driving conditions that might result from the con-dition of the roads. 3.
- That the plan of operation, setbacks and reclamation plan proposed by the applicant and attached to or shown on the application be followed, and that the applicant file a performance bond with the County Zoning Administrator, in an amount set by the Board of County Commissioners, to insure compliance with the reclamation plans within six months of the termination of quarry operations, and that such bond shall also in-sure the maintenance of County Road 1029 used by the quarry operation to original condition or as might otherwise be agreed to in accordance with Condition No. 3. The amount of the performance bond shall be based upon \$1500/acre for any land area disturbed and not reclaimed at this site, however; the Board of County Commissioners may amend or require a revised base figure at any time they believe such to be reasonable; 4.

5. That this Conditional Use Permit shall be subject to annual review by the planning staff; and

That the berm be covered with vegetation, meeting the recommendations of the Soil Conservation Service.

Motion was seconded by Mrs. Bradley and carried unanimously.
