	After a thorough review of these applications it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that these recommendations of Mr. Coleman be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.
	Ted McFarlane, Manager of the Douglas County Ambulance Service, appeared be- fore the Board to present a recommendation on the purchase of a new 1977 mod- ular ambulance from the Modular Ambulance Corporation in the net amount of \$23,291 which includes the trade in value of \$500 on the 1969 Oldsmobile am- bulance. This recommended purchase would be the lowest of the three bids which were received by the commission during its meeting on January 13, 1977. Mr. McFarlane's recommendation indicates that this ambulance will meet all federal specifications and will therefore qualify for reimbursement from the Mid-Am- erica Regional Council Emergency Rescue in the amount of \$10,000 from our cur- rent HEW 1203 Grant. The recommendation is founded upon having received a letter of confirmation from the Modular Ambulance Corporation which indicates commitment to guarantee the module for a minimum of ten years as long as it receives reasonable care and maintenance commensurate with the capabilities in Douglas County. After a full consideration to purchase the 1977 modular ambu- lance from Modular Ambulance Corporation in the net amount of \$23,291 be ap- proved. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Bradley and carried unanimously.
