The Board considered Resolution No. 77-15 which resolution refers specifically to the requirements of K.S.A. 19-436 which statute requires that the Board give public notice of the total projected budget of the county appraiser's office for fiscal year 1978 in order that that amount levied for that purpose shall be exempt from the aggregate tax levy limitations of Douglas County, and if within sixty days after the last publication of this notice a petition signed by electors of Douglas County equal in number to not less than five percent of the total qualified electors of Douglas County is filed in the office of the County Election Officer requesting an election thereon, such costs shall be within the aggregate tax levy limitation of the county unless a proposition to exclude the same from such limitation is submitted to and approved by a majority of the electors of the county voting at an election called and held thereon. If within such period no sufficient protest is filed or if the electors approve such proposition at an election called and held thereon, that portion of the tax levies of such county which is levied for the purpose of paying costs incurred by the county in complying with the provisions of K.S.A. 19-430 et seq. shall not be included in computing the aggregate tax levies of the county and as exempt from the limitations imposed under the provision of K.S.A. 1976 Supp. 79-5001 to 79-5016, inclusive. After complete review of the details of this resolution it was moved by Mr. Neis that the projected budget for 1978 for the county appraiser's office be set for the purpose of publication to be \$142,000, and that the details of this resolution be published in accordance with K.S.A. 19-436 in order that this projected budgeted amount may be exempt from the aggregate tax levy of Douglas County for the budget year 1978. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Bradley and carried unanimously.
