Grand i app. Tunding for half way house	Mr. Bill Arnold, representing Douglas County Transitional Living Association Inc. presented to the Board an application for subgrant to the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration for initial funding and action on a pro- gram described as "development of a local halfway house for offenders". The total budget presented in this grant application was in the amount of \$66,720 of which Douglas County's share as contributor of local match will be \$3,336 which will be paid from previously committed revenue sharing funds, if and when the grant application is approved. After a lengthy and complete review of the application it was moved by Mrs. Bradley, that we commit the local matching contribution to this application and sign it and forward it to the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration with a recommendation for ap- proval by that body, that the application should include a cover letter from this Board which would indicate that there is no guarantee of future funding for this project as required for the local matching share until such time as a careful review of the project would be conducted when the time of the ap- plication for second year and subsequent years arise, that the Board would make a careful review of the project to determine its acceptance by the com- munity, the degree of self sufficiency achieved by the home, what beneficial effect it may be having on Douglas County's corrections system, and the a- vailability of funds for this participation. Assuming an affirmative answer to all of these considerations, future support for this project from the Board of Douglas County Commissioners would be forthcoming. The Board noted receipt of an application for a cereal malt beverage license from Harrison F. Johnson, Jr. for use at the Tee Pee Gas Station, Route 3, Lawrence, Kansas. The application was signed and remitted to the Grant Town ship Board.

Snip Board. Dean Sanderson, public works director, appeared before the Board to present a request for the purchase of a general purpose clamshell bucket for use in his department. He presented two quotes. The first quote is from Construc-tion Machinery Inc. of Kansas City, Missouri for one Erie Strayer Model GF-38 general purpose clamshell bucket with a 3/8 yard capacity for a net price f.o.b. Lawrence, in the amount of \$3,337. The second quote was from the G.W Van Keppel Company of Kansas City, Missouri which is for a Type M Owen gener purpose clamshell bucket, size #19, with 3/8 cu. yard in the amount of \$3,74 Mr. Sanderson recommended that we accept the quote of Construction Machinery Inc. in the amount of \$3,337 and after brief discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and car-ried unanimously. 1 ried unanimously.

Tied unanimously. Kathy Smith, administrator of Valleyview, appeared before the Board to re-quest the purchase of a calculator for use in her office. She presented three quotes as follows: Crane & Company for a Canon P1010 calculator at a net price of \$125.10, M & M Office Supply for a Rockwell 212P at a net price of \$116.96, and Strong's Office Systems for a Victor electronic printing cal culator, Model 305 at a net price of \$134. Ms. Smith recommended the pur-chase of the Canon P1010 from Crane & Company based on the fact that it has the feature of accumlative memory which the Rockwell, which was actually the low quote, does not have. After a brief review of this recommendation it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved and the purchase made from Crane & Company, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously
