Vacate streets
in Clinton

Brian Fitzhugh, representing Tom McGee, engineering division supervisor, appeared before the Board to present two requests to vacate a road as provided in K.S.A. 68-102. The first request is drawn by Dale A. Johnson to vacate a portion of alleyway in the townsite of Clinton, in Douglas County, Kansas, described as the alleys between First and Second and E. and F. Streets in Block No. 25 in the townsite of Clinton, Kansas, as shown on the Plat of Clinton, Kansas, recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds, Douglas County, Kansas. The second request is from Marie Arnett requesting the vacation of that part of Street G. west of Lots 4, 5, and 6 in Block 7 in the townsite of Clinton, Kansas, Douglas County, Kansas, as recorded on the Plat of Clinton, Kansas in the Register of Deeds of Douglas County, Kansas. The reasons claimed for both of these vacations is that the road is not a public utility by reason of neglect, nonuse, or inconvenience in that said road has never been opened, is not in any way improved, and is not nor has it ever been in use. Based on these requests to vacate it is recommended to the Board that pursuant to the authority granted to the County Commissioners in K.S.A. 68-102 that a notice of public hearing will be published for three consecutive weeks on the first, second, and third Wednesday of July with a public hearing for final determination of whether said road should be vacated at 10:00 a.m. on the 25th day of July 1977, to be held in the office of the County Commission at which time any interested persons will be heard on objections to vacate said roads. After review it was moved by Mr. Neis that said notice be published as recommended and that the hearing date be set as recommended, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
