The Board considered Resolution No. 77-30 which resolution indicates that Douglas County is desirous of utilizing the services and resources of the Surplus Property Section of the Kansas State Department of Administration. The authority for this usage is granted by the Federal Property and Admini-strative Services Act of 1949, as amended, and makes available federal sur-plus personal property to public agencies for public purposes and to nonpro-fit tax-exempt health and educational institutions. Within this resolution Douglas County certifies that it is qualified as an agency under this federal act and further certifies that this property is needed and will be used by the recipient on behalf of the residents of its jurisdiction. Douglas County certifies that the items of property shall be used in accordance with regu-lations established by the agency director and certifies that it agrees that it will not sell, trade, lease, lend, bail, encumber or otherwise dispose of such property without prior approval of the General Services Administration or the State Agency, in the event that the property is of sufficient value to qualify for these limitations. It is herein resolved that the eligibility of Douglas County be established to participate in the State-Federal Property Assistance Program and further resolves that the Vice Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County be authorized to act on behalf of the gov-erning body to acquire federal surplus property and so obligate the governing body to the aforementioned certifications and agreements, and that such per-son be authorized, at his discretion, to further delegate authority to any agent of the applicant organization for the purpose of acquiring surplus pro-perty for the use of the applicant. The Board then considered a Civil Rights Assurance which is necessary to be made in conjunction with Resolution No. 77-30 to the State Department of Ad-ministration. By this assurance Douglas County agrees to abide by all re-quirements imposed by or pursuant to the regulations of the General Services Administration issued under the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 606 of Title VI of the Federal Property and Administra-tion Act of 1973, as amended to the end, that no person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color, national origin, or sex, or that no other wise qualified handicapped person shall solely by reason of the handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity for which Douglas County re-ceived Federal assistance from the General Services Administration.
