Tom McGee, engineering division manager, appeared before the Board to present a utility agreement on Project No. 23-RS-1347(7) between Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County which a-greement relates to provisions of K.S.A. 17-1901 as to the necessity for move ment of utility equipment and facilities which are located on county right-of-way. The agreement indicates that relocation of existing facilities which are currently located on private easement will be paid for by Douglas County and that those facilities within county right-of-way will be moved at utility company expense, and that the construction or alterations of the company's facilities shall be completed within thirty days after the county furnishes to the company the required information. After review of this agreement, it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that this utility agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried.

Clinton Phuy. Pub. Works: app. Wility agreement Obstahama Gado. #1 23 AHL 1593(2)

The Board reviewed a utility agreement between Cities Service Gas Company of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas; and the Secretary of Transportation of the State of Kansas on Project 23 AHL 1593 (2), otherwise known as Clinton Parkway. The agreement indicates that work to be done in moving the Cities Service Gas Company line which crosses Clinton Parkway in the approximate area between Highway Stations 30 and 35 as shown on the project plans will be done by contract with the estimated total cost of the work to be accomplished in the amount of \$37,517, of which it is projected 100% will be paid by the county. The work to be performed includes the installation of approximately 940 linear feet of .250 wall 16" carrier line and to reclaim approximately 713 linear feet of .250 wall 16" carrier line. The utility estimates its work can be completed in a thirty day period. After a complete review of the terms of this utility agreement it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that it be approved and forwarded to the Secre-tary of Transportation for his review and approval, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried. and carried.

Clinton Pkuy: aff Utility ogreement K7+1.

The Board reviewed the utility agreement between The Kansas Power & Light Company and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas and the Sec-retary of Transportation on Project 23 AHL 1593 (2), otherwise known as Clin-ton Parkway. This utility agreement is to relocate facilities of the utility which are located wholly or in part on private easements between Highway Sta-tions 19 and 21 and 53 and 54 as shown on the plans of said project. It is indicated that the work to be accomplished will be performed by contract in the estimated total cost of \$12,244 less any credit for salvage with 100% of the cost of the project to be borne by the county. After review of the terms of the utility agreement it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that it be approved and forwarded to the Secretary of Transportation for his review and approval, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried.
