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Mr. McGee also presented the Board a contract for right-of-way on Bridge Pro-ject No. 16.30N-02.00E between the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County and Evelyn A. Stull, a single person, RFD 1, Lecompton, Kansas. This agree-ment indicates purchase of 0.70 acres of right-of-way easement, 0.61 acres temporary easement for construction, and 77 rods of 5-wire barb fence and in-cludes allowance for 38 rods of temporary fencing, future abstracting costs, irregularity of fencing, permanent irregularity of fields for farming, 2/5 of 0.65 acres of hay crop and 2/5 of 0.66 acres of corn crop and also con-struction of temporary detour road within the 0.61 acres of temporary ease-ment in the lump sum amount of \$2,763.60. After review of this agreement it was moved by Mr. Neis that the agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. White-night, and carried. night, and carried.

Mr. McGee then presented for the Board's consideration'a tenant contract for right-of-way on Bridge Project No. 16.30N-02.00E between the Board of Douglas County Commissioners and Clifford Nichols, RFD 1, Lecompton, Kansas, in the lump sum amount of \$86.40, which is an allowance for 3/5 of 0.66 acres of hay crop and 3/5 of 0.65 acres of corn crop. Mr. Nichols is a tenant on the pro-perty owned by Evelyn A. Stull, a single person, whom a previous right-of-way easement has been established. After review of this agreement it was moved by Mr. Neis that the agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried.

At 11:00 a.m. the chairman announced that the hour had come for opening bids on the \$870,000 Parkway Bonds, Series 1978. The County Clerk, D. E. Mathia, was present and performed the duties of his office. Present for the bid opening were Warren Rhodes, President of First National Bank of Lawrence, and Charles Stough, County Bond Counsel. Sealed bids were then submitted by rep-resentatives of various investment firms. Such bids were thereupon opened and read to the Board of County Commissioners, as follows:
