In this recommendation it is pointed out to the Board that when the court employees become employees of the state as of the first of the year 1979, there will be in some cases, a substantial loss of benefits, namely, sick leave and vacation time, which will be lost up on the changeover. The judge recommends that these nonjudicial employees, who are terminating employment with Douglas County and then be assumed by the state as state employees, be compensated for the unused vacation time and sick leave which they will, in fact, be losing by this transfer of employment. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that it be the policy of the Board that the earned and unused vacation time and sick leave, which may not be carried forward into the state employment system for those terminating non- judicial employees of the unified district court, be compensated for in the same way as if these employees were permanently terminating their employeement with Douglas County.
