Weed Deept. : app Set rates for 1979 sale of 2, 4-D	Mr. Duver then presented figures which indicate the administrative cost per gallon of 2,4-D for the year 1979 is recommended to be set at the rate of \$0.48 per gallon. By applying that recommended administrative cost figure to an average cost per gallon of materials on order and on hand of \$4.72 per galla a figure of \$5.20 per gallon is applied for an overall cost per gallon on the average. In accordance with the terms of the statute of the State of Kansas, Mr. Duver recommends that we set the rate of \$3.90 which is 75% of the total cost of product administration. After review of this recommendation it was moved by Mr. Neis that we set the rate of \$3.90 per gallon as our net per gal- lon charge to the customers of Douglas County for the year 1979, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
