*Weed Dept.
report*

Mr. Duver presented the Board a copy of his monthly report which shows the activities of his office during the month of January 1979, and also presented the Douglas County Weed Department Annual Report for 1978.

Mr. Duver then recommended to the Board the acceptance of a low bid for 8,000 gallons of 2,4-D Amine which bids were received at the office of the Shawnee County noxious weed director. The low bid for this product is from the Cornbelt Chemical Company, McCook, Nebraska, in the amount of \$4.41 per gallon or a total amount of \$35,280. It is designated in the Douglas County specifications that this 8,000 gallons of 2,4-D is to be delivered no later than April 6, 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this low bid be accepted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Duver then presented figures which indicate the administrative cost per gallon of 2,4-D for the year 1979 is recommended to be set at the rate of \$0.48 per gallon. By applying that recommended administrative cost figure to an average cost per gallon of materials on order and on hand of \$4.72 per gallon, a figure of \$5.20 per gallon is applied for an overall cost per gallon on the average. In accordance with the terms of the statute of the State of Kansas, Mr. Duver recommends that we set the rate of \$3.90 which is 75% of the total cost of product administration. After review of this recommendation it was moved by Mr. Neis that we accept the \$0.44 recommended for applied administrative charges and that we set the rate of \$3.90 per gallon as our net per gallon charge to the customers of Douglas County for the year 1979, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

After review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this contract be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

The Board considered Resolution No. 79-11 which resolution related to the policy of having only one active bank account for Douglas County, Kansas, to be rotated on an annual basis to each of the six banks in Douglas County, Kansas, and the Kaw Valley State Bank of Eudora, Kansas, would, under such sequence, be eligible for the active account on April 21, 1979, but desires to defer its place in said rotation until next year, allowing the Baldwin State Bank, Baldwin City, Kansas, to have the active account as of April 21, 1979. All of the six banks in Douglas County, Kansas, have been notified of this request to change the rotation and none of the six banks have expressed any opposition. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried. Mr. Neis absented himself from any part of the decision making in regard to this resolution.
