Personnel: Employ John Gobetz (CETA) Bob Duver, noxious weed director, appeared before the Board to recommend the employment of John E. Gobetz in the position of noxious weed helper, employed under the CETA, Title VI program, at the starting salary of \$600 per month, effective April 6, 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously. This CETA position will expire on September 30, 1979.

Alan Miller Employ Robert Sinclair Don Gordon, appraiser, appeared before the Board to recommend the employment of Alan P. Miller and Robert W. Sinclair in the position of field appraiser, at the starting salary of \$775 per month, effective April 14, 1979 for Mr. Sinclair and effective April 28, 1979 for Mr. Miller. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Ambulance Insp. Repair boiler Phil Leonard, risk management administrator, appeared before the Board to report the results of an inspection made at the Douglas County Ambulance Service building on April 6, 1979. During the inspection a boiler leak was discovered. Huxtable & Associates, Inc. was contacted to give an estimate to repair the boiler. They quoted a price of \$400 for a cutoff valve and replacing the actual leak, and the replacement or addition of emersion type aquastat valve. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this quote be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Misc: app. Co. to pay for Leonard to attend NACO Mr. Leonard also discussed the NACO National Conference on "The Liability Crisis in County Government" (Tort) on April 22-26, 1979, in Chicago. It was moved by Mr. Neis that the county pay the expenses for Phil Leonard to attend this conference, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Personnel: app. Poll workers salary set Delbert Mathia, county clerk, appeared before the Board to recommend that the poll workers be paid a salary of \$3.00 per hour to be effective April 1, 1979, under the provisions of K.S.A. 25-2811. This is an increase from \$2.30 per hour to \$3.00 per hour. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Ambulance: app. Purchase movie projector & overhead projector Ted McFarlane, Douglas County Ambulance Service Manager, appeared before the Board with three quotes for (1) 16mm movie projector and (1) overhead projector. Mr. McFarlane recommended that the Board accept the quote of Kansas City Audio Visual, Kansas City, Missouri, for the purchase of the 16 mm movie projector with accessories in the amount of \$608.37 and the purchase of the overhead projector with accessories in the amount of \$255.15. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this quote be accepted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Ambulance: app. Purchase sink & cabinet Mr. McFarlane then discussed the need for a sink and cabinet for the ambulance department. Mr. McFarlane stated that he had contacted several places of business in regard to this sink and cabinet and that Wickes Lumber quoted the lowest price that being \$350 to \$400. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that the Board accept the quote from Wickes Lumber, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Pub. Works: app. Purchase motor grader Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board to discuss the purchase of a motor grader in regard to the sealed bids received and opened at 10:00 a.m. on April 5, 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board accept the bid of Sellers Tractor Company, Topeka, Kansas, for the Fiat-Allis, Model FAZ00C, in the amount of \$59,995, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Lone Star: app. Engineering agreement for improvements Mr. Dooley then presented the Board an Agreement for Engineering Services between the County of Douglas County and Ponzer-Sears-Youngquist, consulting engineers of Olathe, Kansas. This agreement is for engineering services pertaining to Lone Star Lake improvements. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously. A copy of this agreement will be on file in the commission office.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 11, 1979.
