Misc.: Commissioners as fence viewers for Westhouse and Brecheisen.
Pursuant to K.S.A. 29-304 the Commissioners acted as fence viewers in a controversy between Eugene A. Westerhouse and Amos W. Westerhouse and Jesse E. Brecheisen over a fence between their properties. The Commissioners met at 3:00 p.m. pursuant to notice given to the parties. Those appearing at said time at the location of the fence in addition to the County Commissioners were: Eugene A. Westerhouse, Jesse E. Brecheisen, Wesley Brecheisen, Leonard Findley, from Gardner, Kansas, assisting Mr. Jesse E. Brecheisen, and Mr. Dan Young, County Counselor. The parties stated their respective positions. The Commissioners thoroughly examined the fence. After one hour the Commissioners took the matter under advisement and returned to Lawrence.

The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 1873. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Personnel: Employ A. Boyle
Mike Malone, District Attorney, appeared before the Board to recommend the employment of E. Ann Boyle in the position of legal and child support secretary, at the starting salary of \$617 per month, effective May 1, 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Sp. Adj. All ambulance personnel
Ted McFarlane, Douglas County Ambulance Service Manager, appeared before the Board to recommend wage adjustments for personnel in his department. Mr. McFarlane stated that the Kansas Minimum Wage and Maximum Hour Law (K.S.A. 44-1201 et. seq.) was amended to include those "engaged in the delivery of emergency medical services" in the overtime exemption previously granted to only law enforcement and fire protection personnel. This change was effective April 26, 1979 when it was published in the Topeka Daily Capitol. Mr. McFarlane therefore requested that the Board approve the following wage adjustments, to be effective April 28, 1979, to take advantage of the new provisions:
