Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, appeared before the Board to recommend the approval of Resolution No. 79-32 which is an affirmation of the decision made as reported in the minutes of October 17, 1979. By this document it is unanimously resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County that under the "Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas," the following changes in zoning classification be made: Zoning classification is changed from "A-1" (Suburban Home Residential) to "A" (Agricultural) on property described as follows:

Point of beginning being the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 8, Township 13, Range 21, Douglas County, Kansas, thence North 800 feet; thence West 545 feet; thence South 800 feet; thence East 545 feet to the point of beginning. Containing approximately 10 acres, more or less.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this resolution be approved and published in accordance with the requirements of the law, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried.
