Kellum, zoning administrator; C. C. Mathews, Mayor, City of Lecompton; and Louis Traxler, Lecompton City Council member. This item is CUP-12-6-79 which is a request for a Conditional Use Permit to allow the City of Lecompton to construct a water supply well on the property generally described as being located approximately 1/4 mile northwest of the city limits. This property is legally described as a tract of land lying in the East 1/2 of Section 34, Township 11 South, Range 18 East of the 6th Principal Meridian, Douglas County, Kansas, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the west line of the east 1/2 of said Section 34 and 3,933.00 feet north of the south line of said Section, thence east at right angles 50.00 feet; thence west at right angles 50.00 feet to the west line of said east 1/2; thence south along said west line 50.00 feet to the point of beginning, submitted by Kramer Engineering and Surveying for the City of Lecompton. This item comes to the County with a recommendation for approval from the planning staff, the Lecompton Planning Commission, and the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission. After hearing all the facts presented, Mrs. Bradley stated that she would like to defer this matter until such time that the County Commission has a regular Board meeting.

The Board considered Resolution No. 80-7 which resolution places two miles of a certain Douglas County constructed roadway, Route No. 130, previously known as Douglas County Route No. 458, in the Township Road Mileage of Eudora Township.
