Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, presented the Board Resolution No. 80-23. By this document it is unanimously resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County that under the "Zoning regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas," the following changes in zoning classification be made: Zoning classification is changed from "A-1" (Suburban Home Residential) to "B-1" (Neighborhood Business) on a recorded subdivision plat described as Clinton Parkway Nursery. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this resolution be approved and published in accordance with the requirements of the law, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.
