The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of July 21, 1980.

The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 1981 and 1982. Orders are on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Ted McFarlane, Douglas County Ambulance Service Manager, notified the Board that Steven O. Guinn will terminate on August 1, 1980.

Mr. McFarlane then recommended to the Board the employment of John J. Drees, in the position of EMIC-T, at the rate of \$1100 per month, effective August 2, 1980. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mr. McFarlane then recommended the approval of "acting supervisor" pay for those EMIC-Ts who are expected to assume the duties of supervisor for a 24-hour shift when the supervisor is absent. The pay to be \$10 per day in addition to their regular pay. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mr. McFarlane then recommended the payment of \$200 to Linda Gericke, R.N., for conducting a coronary care class for Douglas County ambulance service technicians on July 17 and 24 for a total time of 16 hours. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mr. McFarlane then presented the Board the Douglas County Ambulance Service report for the second quarter of 1980.

Mr. McFarlane then recommended to the Board a publication of Notice to Bidders on the purchase of radio communications equipment to be used primarily by the county ambulance service. Bids shall be received at the office of the Board of Commissioners, 11th & Massachusetts, Lawrence, Kansas, until 10:00 a.m., Thursday, August 14, 1980, at which time they will be publicly opened. Mr. McFarlane recommends that this notice be published on three consecutive Fridays beginning July 25, 1980. After review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this notice be issued as recommended, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the requests brought before it by various agencies which had requested an allocation of revenue sharing funds for the year 1981. After a complete review of all of these requests, and having met with the City of Lawrence to determine our mutual obligations for funding such organizations, it was moved by Mr. Cragan that the following allocations be approved for budget publication:
