The Board considered Item No. 4 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of July 23, 1980. This item is Final Plats of Twin Ridge Heights East and Twin Ridge Heights West, a residential county subdivision which is being final platted into two plats, containing approximately 214.16 gross acres and located in LeCompton Township. The subdivision is located in Section 7-12-19 and can be reached via Middle Road to Township Road 207 and then north along Township Road 563 and is submitted by John Selk with Landplan Engineering for Dwight Jackson.
