Private road

Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, and Jarvis Brink appeared before the Board to request approval for a private road described as following:

Beginning at a point 330 feet West and 26 feet South of the Northeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section 35, Township 12, Range 18, for a point of beginning, thence West parallel with the North line of said quarter section, a distance of 590 feet, thence South parallel with the East line of said quarter section, a distance of 70 feet, thence East parallel with the North line of said quarter section, a distance of 660 feet; thence North 66 feet, more or less, to the South line of Township Road 126, thence West along the South line of said Township Road, a distance of 70 feet; thence North 4 feet to the point of beginning.

Mr. Brink submitted the Board a copy of a 70-foot easement which Douglas County Rural Water District No. 1 has joined in with the Brink's for an ingress and egress to serve a five acre tract of land. After a discussion with County Counselor Dan Young concerning this easement, it was moved by Mr. Neis that this request be approved to serve one building site with the understanding that this private road will not be the responsibility of the township or county to maintain, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
