Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board and presented correspondence from Mr. Lynn Burris, Jr., State Liaison Officer of The Kansas State Park and Resources Authority, which requests an Annual Operation and Maintenance Assurance Statement on Wells Overlook Regional Park. This Assurance Statement is required of Douglas County since this project was in part funded by the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation funds. The statement includes a number of requirements for maintenance and appearance of the facility and a certification of non-discrimination in the use of the facility. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this Assurance Statement be executed and returned to the state for signing by the State Park and Resources Authority, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
