with a radius of 130.00 feet; thence left on said curve to a point on the Easterly right of way line of county road established in 1957 and terminating at said point. As a result of neglect or nonuse, said road has become impassable and for said reasons, in the judgement of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, said road does not constitute a public utility. The above described road constitutes less than two consecutive miles of road. Based on this request to vacate it is recommended to the Board that pursuant to the authority granted to the County Commissioners in K.S.A. 68-102 that a notice of public hearing will be published for three consecutive weeks, April 23, April 30, and May 7, 1981, with a public hearing for final determination of whether said road should be vacated at 9:00 a.m. on the 11th day of May 1981, to be held in the office of the County Commission at which time any interested persons will be heard on objections to vacate said road. After review it was moved by Mr. Cragan that said notice be published as recommended and that the hearing date be set as recommended, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Friday, April 10, 1981, for the sole purpose of canvassing ballots of the April 7, 1981 School and City General Election. All other business will be conducted on Monday, April 13, 1981.
