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office for fiscal year 1982 in order that that amount levied for that purpose shall be exempt from the aggregate tax levy limitations of Douglas County, and if within sixty days after the last publication of this notice a petition signed by electors of Douglas County equal in number to not less than five percent of the total qualified electors of Douglas County is filed in the office of the County Election Officer requesting an election thereon, such costs shall be within the aggregate tax levy limitation of the county unless a proposition to exclude the same from such limitation is submitted to and approved by a majority of the electors of the county voting at an election called and held thereon. If within such period no sufficient protest is filed or if the electors approve such proposition at an election called and held thereon, that portion of the tax levies of such county which is levied for the purpose of paying costs incurred by the county in complying with the pro-visions of K.S.A. 19-430 et seq. shall not be included in computing the ag-gregate tax levies of the county and as exempt from the limitations imposed under the provision of K.S.A. 75-5001 to 79-5016, inclusive. After complete review of the details of this resolution it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the projected budget for 1982 for the county appraiser's office be set for the purpose of publication to be \$250,500, and that the details of this resolu-tion be published in accordance with K.S.A. 19-436 in order that this projected budgeted amount may be exempt from the aggregate tax levy of Douglas County for the budget year 1982. This motion was seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously. unanimously.

The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. C-1995-1 to the Sheriff, Clerk of District Court, and Treasurer.

George Little, data processing director, notified the Board that Kimberly J. O'Bryon will terminate on April 24, 1981.

At the hour of 10:00 a.m., the Board discussed two planning items with David Guntert, staff member of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Department. Also in attendance was Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator. The Board first considered Item No. 6 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of March 25, 1981. This item is a text amendment to County Zoning Regulations, Article 14, Section 14-3.4, Public/Private Recreation Facili-ties in the "V-C" Valley Channel District. This text amendment is to Article 14, Section 14-3.4, which allows public and private commercial recreational facilities in the "V-C" Valley Channel District.

Amending Section 14-3.4 to read (new wording underlined) as follows:

Public or private commercial recreational facilities and structures, provided such structures conform to the requirements of Section 14-2 and Article 19 of this Resolution.

This text amendment is to the Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Terri tory of Douglas County, Kansas. This item comes to the Board with a recom-mendation of unanimous approval from the Planning Commission.
