rent emergency room, but would like the proposed garage and living quarters to be attached to the hospital to allow ambulance technicians to work and train with hospital personnel when time permits. Mr. Ohlen stated that the next step will be for he and Mr. McFarlane to meet with an architect to study the sites and come up with the best possible plan. Also, for both projects, the renovation of the existing ambulance station at 1839 Massachusetts, and an ambulance station located on the hospital property, the county will seek cooperation from the City of Lawrence because the city owns the current station and holds the deed to the hospital land.

Mr. McFarlane then presented the Board the Douglas County Ambulance Service Financial Highlites as of March 31, 1981.

Mr. McFarlane then recommended that the call pay be increased from \$10 to \$15 per day, and from \$5 to \$10 for the evening shift, effective May 9, 1981. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

LeRoy McDermott, Douglas County drug abuse coordinator, appeared before the Board to brief the Board on developments since the last report in regard to the merging of the Douglas County Drug Abuse Council and Douglas County Committee on Alcoholism.

Jerry Kemberling, noxious weed director, appeared before the Board to recommend the purchase of 60 gallons of Gordons 2,4-D in one-gallon containers, from Mid States Ag. Chemical, Inc., Olathe, Kansas, in the total amount of \$546.60. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board and presented an Authority and Method Procedure Form covering Project No. 23 C-1171-01 (RS 1084 (3)) which consists of 2.44 miles of grading, seeding, and surfacing work on FAS Route 214, Lecompton, west. County funds in the approximate amount of \$116,000 will be available for the matching of federal funds to finance construction work on this project. Mr. Dooley then presented a Certification of Real Property Acquisition Procedures for the same project. This certifies that all real property acquired for the project was done so in compliance with listed procedures which are required by Federal and State law. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that these documents be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Monday, May 11, 1981. On Thursday, May 7 and Friday, May 8, 1981, the Board will be in Wichita, Kansas, attending the Spring 5th Annual County Commissioners Conference.

Inasmuch as the County Commissioners are committed to be out of the County on May 8, 1981, the Canvass of the Election held in Marion Township on Tuesday, May 5, 1981, will be held at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, May 11, 1981, that being the next regular meeting date.
