Seven bids were received for Project No. 81-1 and four bids were received for Project No. 81-2. After a brief review it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that we take the bids under advisement for review by the engineering depart-ment and consultant for their review to make a recommendation at a later time, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
