Michael Heck, representing Douglas County Bond Attorney Charles Stough, appeared before the Board and presented Resolution No. 81-57 which resolution relates to the authorizing and directing the issuance of the general obligation sewer bonds of Douglas County, Kansas, in the principal amount of \$600,000 for the purpose of providing for the expenses of sanitary sewerage by creating a sewer district in said county, pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 19-2704a, et seq., as amended, and K.S.A. 19-2715b (Yankee Tank Main Sewer District #2). Following review of the resolution it was moved by Mr. Cragan that Resolution No. 81-57 be hereby adopted, seconded by Mrs. Bradley and carried unanimously.
