The Board discussed an Agreement between Cottonwood, Inc., a non-profit corporation, and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County. The term of this Agreement shall commence on January 1, 1982 and terminate on December 31, 1982, and the County shall pay to Cottonwood for the services provided, the sum of \$70,000 to be paid at the earliest times of Douglas County tax distributions. In consideration of the payment of said sum, Cottonwood shall furnish and render the services for the mentally retarded as set forth in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq. as amended. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this Agreement be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
