The Board spoke to a number of young people from Eudora and Baldwin High Schools who are involved in the American Legion program called "County Govern ment Day". The Board and other elected officers in the courthouse spent time describing to these visiting young people the nature of their functions in government and the personal attitudes of the various officials toward local government.

The Board met with auctioneer Hal Crady to discuss the process for conducting an auction to sell the Hougland House at the Douglas County 4-H Fairgrounds on Saturday, April 17, 1982, at 10:00 a.m. Douglas County purchased this property as an addition to the fairgrounds from Sherman F. Hougland and Max-ine P. Hougland, husband and wife, at 1920 Harper, Lawrence, in the fall of 1980 and early 1981.
