The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with two members of the Board present. Mrs. Bradley was absent due to attending a Jayhawk Area Agency on Aging meeting in Topeka. Student representatives Mandy Downs and Lisa Gaumnitz were also present.

Proj. 23C-1215-01*

Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board and presented an Authority and Method Procedure Form covering Project No. 23 C-1215-01 (RS 196 [1]) which consists of 0.321 miles of grading and bridge work on FAS Route 211, 1.0 mile South K-10 & Lawrence, South. County funds in the approximate amount of \$102,400 will be available for the matching of federal funds to finance construction work on this project. Mr. Dooley then presented a Certification of Real Property Acquisition Procedures for the same project. This certifies that all real property acquired for the project was done so in compliance with listed procedures which are required by Federal and State law. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that these documents be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

Mr. Dooley then presented an Application from Southwestern Bell Telephone Company seeking authority to construct buried telephone cable on Douglas County Route No. 442, Section 26, Township 12S, Range 18E, in Douglas County, Kansas. This Application has been thoroughly reviewed by the public works department and its approval is recommended to the Board by Mr. Dooley. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that it be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

Mr. Dooley then presented a quote for traffic paint and thinner in the amount of \$17,209.62 from Kansas Correctional Industries, Lansing, Kansas. Mr. Dooley stated that this was the only quote he received and recommended that it be approved. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried. These items are 100% reimbursable.

Mr. Dooley then recommended after reviewing the bids that the Board accept the low bid of W. A. Dunbar & Son Trucking and Excavating, Inc., Lawrence, in the total amount of \$68,620 for Sediment Removal at the Southwest Arm of Lone Star Lake. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.
