Personvel Term The Board noted receipt of a memo from District Attorney Michael J. Malone m. Malone Stating that he will resign as District Attorney of the Seventh Judicial District effective upon his being sworn in as the Associate District Judge Malone on July 15, 1982.

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Ruth Foster, Valleyview administrator, appeared before the Board to recommend employment of the following:

(1) Vicki L. Munden, in the position of certified nurse aide, temp rary, full-time, at the rate of \$3.55 per hour, effective July 6, 1982. tempo-

(2) Linda S. Martin, in the position of nurse aide, permanent, part-time, at the rate of \$3.35 per hour, effective July 13, 1982.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that these recommendations be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Foster then notified the Board of the following terminations: Judy Katterhagen on July 2, Kristan Norris on July 10, Jennifer Weir on July 14, Katterhagen on July 2, Kristan Nor and Linda Martin on July 15, 1982.

Mrs. Foster then recommended that Melissa Retke be reclassified from certi-fied medication aide with a salary of \$4.70 per hour to LPN with a salary of \$5.50 per hour, effective July 3, 1982. Mr. Dooley stated that because of this employee's poor work and attendance record as well as the lack of adequate sick leave and vacation leave balance to evidence a good attendance record and carry the employee through a severe medi-cal incident and as a disciplinary measure for misplaced equipment, it is recommended that up to a 45 day leave-of-absence without pay be granted this employee under the following conditions:

(1) A physician's statement releasing him for unrestricted work duties be furnished prior to returning to work.

(2) Employee be reclassified to a Common Laborer at an annual salary of \$11,000 per year effective the first day of returning to work duties.

Employee be placed on a probationary status not to exceed six rom date of returning to work duties. It is understood that work (3) months from date of returning to work duties. performance and attendance must improve during this period.

Any promotion or return to Semi-Skilled Operator classification will be determined on qualifications and availability of position. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that these recommendations be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
