The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 3137. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

At 9:00 a.m., as advertised, the Board opened bids for the purchase of speci-fied furnishings for the new ambulance facility under construction at 225 Maine, Lawrence, Kansas. Four bids were received. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the Board take the bids under advisement and for Mr. McFarlane to make a recommendation at a later time, seconded by Mrs. Hiebert, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of check in the amount of \$5036.44 from the Depart-ment of Health & Environment, Topeka, Kansas, for the Lone Star Lake Restora-tion Program, Contract #82-127, for services provided from September 1, 1982 thru December 31, 1982.
