Fitness testing
program

Ted McFarlane, Douglas County ambulance service manager, appeared before the Board with Mike Bahrke, Professor of Physical Education at Kansas University, Lawrence, to discuss a pre-employment physical fitness testing program for the ambulance department. After discussion to the benefits of such program, it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that a program be developed for the ambulance department with the developmental cost estimated to be \$400 and ongoing costs of approximately \$15 per applicant. Motion seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously. There was also a discussion concerning a fitness program for current departmental employees and with the understanding that if a program is implemented, it will be done so after a presentation and approval by the Board at a later date.
