The Board considered the appointment of William L. Elkins, Route 2, Lawrence, as a member of the Douglas County Fair Board. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that this appointment be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried. Mr. Elkins is replacing Fred DeLano who resigned as a representa-tive from Palmyra Township.

Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board with a contract for right-of-way for Project 23C-1636-01 (formerly FAS 23RS-1084[3]), Road No. 232, between the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County and Rose Smith, for 1.66 acres of right-of-way easement and 0.02 acres of temporary easement for construction, in the lump sum of \$2900. This lump sum payment includes allowance for irregularity of boundary, loss of an old abandoned house, ac-cess to homesite on frontage due to road bed height, and abstracting. After review of this contract it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that it be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried. R/W R Smith

Mr. Dooley then presented an Authority and Method Procedure Form covering Project No. 23 C-1636-01 (RS 1084 [5]) which consists of 0.265 miles of grading and bridge work on FAS Route 214, Lecompton, West. County funds in the approximate amount of \$97,700 will be available for the matching of federal funds to finance construction work on this project. Mr. Dooley then presented a Certification of Real Property Acquisition Procedures for the same project. This certifies that all real property acquired for the project was done so in compliance with listed procedures which are required by Fed-eral and State law. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that these documents be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.

Mr. Dooley then presented the Board a Contract for Professional Services from Barnett, Stuart and Dow, Inc., consulting geologists, Topeka, Kansas, for Geological Investigation and Report, Bridge over Branch of Deer Creek, Pro-ject No. 23C-1788-01, Douglas County, Kansas, for a maximum price of \$350. Mr. Dooley recommended that this be accepted. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried and carried.

Mr. Dooley then presented the Board a Contract for Professional Services from Barnett, Stuart and Dow, Inc., for Geological Investigation and Report, Bridge over Coal Creek, Project No. 23C-1804-01, Douglas County, Kansas, for a maximum price of \$2300. Mr. Dooley recommended that this be accepted. Af-ter discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that this recommendation be ap-proved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried.
