Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, was also present. The Board considered Item No. 5 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of February 23, 1984. This item is a final plat of Miller's Subdivi-sion, a one-lot county subdivision containing approximately 1.20 acres. The property is located on the north side of Highway 24/40 and on the east side of the road leading to the Municipal Airport (Grant Township Road #88), sub-mitted by Evans, Bierly, Hutchinson and Associates for Paul F. and Mary Lou Miller.
