Mr. Dooley then presented the Board Contract for Federal-Aid Road Construction Engineering by City/County (Force Account Agreement) for Project No. 23 C-2014-01. This agreement is between Douglas County and the Secretary of Transportation of the State of Kansas. The Secretary of Transportation of the State of Kansas pursuant to federal and state law authorizes Douglas County to perform certain construction engineering work on the above noted project consisting of 2.472 miles of surfacing, beginning 2.6 miles North Baldwin City, W. In the execution of this Agreement, Douglas County certifies that it has now available sufficient equipment of suitable type and the necessary employees adequately trained to perform the work required under this Agreement in an economical and workmanlike manner, and Douglas County further certifies that the use of the forces and equipment required for the performance of this work will not interfere with other work which is necessary to be performed by such forces and equipment on other roads in Douglas County. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this Contract for Federal-Aid Road Construction be approved, seconded by Mrs. Hiebert, and carried unanimously.
