

Leecompton Douglas County Monday May 4th 1856

The Hon. the board of County Commissioners met
Pursuant to adjournment Hon. John P. Wood Presiding
and Gen. George W. Johnson associate

The board adjourned until the third Monday in

Leecompton Douglas County
Monday the 21st day of July A.D. 1856

The honorable the board of County Commissioners for
Douglas County was convened by proclamation at the
Court house door by Samuel Cramer Dep. Sheriff
Hon. John W. C. P. Wood and John M. Banks
Presiding

The board received the resignation of William Donaldson
as assessor for the County of Douglas

Ordered by the board that the Treasurer notify the
Sheriff to appear before the board at its next regular session
which is on the 3rd Monday in August to show cause
for failure to settle with the Treasurer

The board appointed William P. Hain assessor in and
for the County of Douglas; who appeared gave his
bond was sworn in according to law and received his
Certificate of appointment

The board received the resignation of Sherman
Waufield as Constable in and for the Township of
Leecompton

The board appointed James C. Thompson to the office of
Constable in and for Leecompton Township, refused to take the
oath and give his bond

The board approved the bond of R. A. Pally and ordered
a Renewal of his License Granted to him by the Clerk
in vacation to keep a dramshop at his stand in
Leecompton
