

The resignation of David Upshaw as Constable of Mauckanusa Township was read and accepted. Thereupon it was ordered that Joseph Cracklin be and is hereby appointed Constable for Mauckanusa Township.

Whereupon it the Court that James E. Carpenter who was appointed Constable for Calhoun Township at the Nov. Term 1857 has failed to qualify. It is hereby ordered by the Court that he the said James E. Carpenter be and is hereby re-appointed Constable for Calhoun Township.

The report of the Commissioners appointed to view and mark out a road from Lawrence to Cambridge by way of Palmyra was read, and the map accompanying the same filed. The report was accepted. and the said Commissioners were authorized to survey and establish the same as a county road and E. H. Land Esq. Justice of the Peace in and for Mauckanusa Township was appointed to direct the road and allot the lands to the several districts along the line of said road in the Township of Mauckanusa. Amasa True Justice of the Peace in and for Calhoun Township was appointed to direct the road and allot the lands to the several districts in the Township of Calhoun.

The Board adjourned to meet tomorrow morning March 13. 1858.
